Villanova University is located at 800 E. Lancaster Avenue (Route 30) in Villanova.

From the west turn left onto Ithan Avenue, proceed about 500 feet and turn left again to enter the campus at the security gate. Let the public safety officers know you are attending the CommUNITY Breakfast. They will be expecting you.

Drive straight about 1000 feet. The Connelly Center (#9 on map) is on your left and the St. Augustine Center for the Liberal Arts Parking Garage (#46 on map) is on your right. Please park in garage and walk over to the Connelly Center.

The Villanova Room is on the ground floor of the Connelly Center.

Notes:

Registration: Thanks for registering in advance! By doing so we are able to have your name tag ready for you and have an accurate catering count.

Name tag: When you arrive please look for the registration volunteers. Proceed there to collect your name tag so others may greet you by name.
