A Note from the Pastor....

HE WAS AMAZED AT THEIR LACK OF FAITH

Amazed at their lack of faith, Jesus was not able to perform any mighty deed in his neighborhood. The people who knew him from childhood were astonished by his teaching in the synagogue. Their astonishment, however, gave way to skepticism for the very reason that they knew him as one of their own. One of the problematic aspects of human nature is that jealousy emerges when we perceive others as “getting above their station.” “Who does he think he is to be doing and saying these things? He’s one of us; we know where he comes from.”

By raising these concerns, the people in his hometown made it evident that Jesus did not have a reputation as a wonder-worker heretofore, that he was just an ordinary man among other ordinary people, discounting any miraculous deeds in his childhood. Something happened to him in his adulthood to cause a shift in his behavior, and what ensued was evidently uncomfortable for them to handle, and so they took offense at him, as the Scriptures state. What might be the nature of that offense?

We know that Jesus reminded people that they had fallen away from their commitment to the covenant relationship with God, just as John the Baptist had before him. This account occurs early in his public ministry; he has already healed the sick and spoken of the need for repentance and reform. A common theme in the healings of Jesus is the reminder that faith has healed the individuals. It stands to reason that a lack of faith would be a self-induced indictment, inevitably causing resentment among those who had become lax in the practice of their faith. His reminder for them to return to God, to be faithful to the covenant, and to practice doing what is right and just, predictably provoked this reaction.

Jesus calls us to reform our way of thinking when it drifts from the tenets of our faith which are focused on doing what is right and just. Sometimes that conflicts with the values of others around us, in our neighborhoods or our country. When it does, our first priority has to be faithfulness to God and the covenant. It is uncomfortable and inconvenient to do so, and we would rather leave things as they are and not rock the boat or make waves.

But that is not the way of Jesus Christ. He came to that awareness after his baptism and his time in the desert, and he called his followers to make it their priority as well. If Jesus were among us today, would we be among those who take offense at what he challenges us to do, or would we follow him?

Stewardship Thought for the Week

“As the Lord spoke to me, the spirit entered me and set me on my feet, and I heard the one who was speaking say to me, ‘Son of man, I am sending you...’”

Ezekiel 2:2-3

God asks each of us to do some special work for Him. He gives us the resources we need to do His work. However, do we listen to God when He calls? Do we get up on our feet and use our talent to do the work He asks of us? Remember, God doesn’t call the equipped, he equips the called.


ST. JOHN'S CASSEROLES

DO YOU KNOW YOUR TRIBUNAL?

The Tribunal is a group of specially qualified Catholics whose responsibility is to come to the help of people who have experienced divorce and who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church.

When a divorce occurs, the Catholic Church always seeks to balance two realities. One is the unbreakableness of the bond of marriage. This is God's law. It cannot be broken by human intervention. On the other hand, the Church is concerned about the spiritual welfare of the people involved. Was this a true marriage? Even though a Catholic marriage was celebrated, was there perhaps some deficiency in the consent of the parties involved? The annulment procedure addresses this problem.
