### *Note from Fr. Joe.....*

Now that things have been gearing up after the summer and we're getting back into our routines, I thought I'd highlight a few points for us to remember. Most importantly, I'd ask that we keep an eye out for our children, especially in the parking lots. Religious Education is back in session; the Preschool is open; and our tenant, the Wolf Performing Arts Center, in the St. Augustine Annex, is in full swing. Please stay with your child when walking through the lots and watch out for the little ones as you drive in and out. It's particularly busy on Sunday mornings at the Rosemont Chapel and Parish Center; be sure to accompany your child to and from Religious Ed. Also, as the Lancaster Avenue Development project progresses at Villanova University, there will be some changes regarding parking and traffic. Please continue to check the bulletin and parish website for updates. Ultimately, the new pedestrian bridge from the Church across Lancaster Avenue to the lots will improve the safety of all – and it will be handicap accessible; spaces, of course, will remain too by the Church for those with special needs.

**An additional point that I've wanted to remind us about for a while is when we arrive for and leave Mass.** I realize that it's not always easy getting the whole family ready, but arrival times seem to be getting later and later over the course of this year. I've seen people, for example, dashing through the lot at Rosemont well over 15 to 20 minutes after Mass has begun. My Mom used to say, "Joseph, you wouldn't be late for a football game or a movie, would you?" Perhaps we can make a little more of an effort, as we're getting back into those post-summer routines. And this applies, as well, to our leaving at the end of Mass. Ironically, some of those arriving late are the first ones leaving – and before the liturgy's even finished. The final blessing and dismissal are more than just a mere formality; they're our being sent forth together to share what we've experienced and received. "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." That starts by how we interact on our way out of church and into the parking lots. Why not take a couple minutes after Mass to meet or catch up with other parishioners? It's not a competition to see who can get to their car first – though it can look that way sometimes!

**As we get closer to the elections in November, it's incumbent upon all of us to practice civility and faithful citizenship.** Please know that we do not allow the posting of any political materials, including the leafleting of cars, on our parish grounds. If you see someone doing so, please politely ask them to stop and report it to myself, Fr. Michael, or another member of the Parish Staff. The only information disseminated through the parish will be from the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (a summary document titled *The Challenges of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* will be made available in the coming weeks) and the Pennsylvania Conference of Catholic Bishops.

**Finally, please consider coming to a course on Addiction Awareness Within Our Society, sponsored by our parish's new Mercy Ministry and beginning on Monday, September 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm in the Rosemont Auditorium.** This is a critical subject that affects so many. Participants are encouraged to attend all four Monday sessions, but each is stand-alone in nature. See this bulletin or the website for more information, including how to RSVP. We want to make sure that we have enough materials.



**About the Course:** These evenings of reflection are designed for all members of our community including the afflicted and their families and friends, counselors, nurses, ministers, deacons, those in the criminal justice system, educators, and anyone who would like to learn more to become part of a solution.

**About the Presenter:** Nina Marie Corona, Ma, CRS, is a Pennsylvania Board Certified Recovery Specialist who received her education certification in Alcohol & Drug Counseling from Villanova University and has recently been hired to teach for Villanova's College of Professional Studies in their Drug and Alcohol counseling program.

### **September 26th - Evening One: Biology**

This four-week series begins with a focus on the biology of addiction. We will take a fairly in depth look at the latest scientific theories of how exactly substances affect the body and the mind. Dependence, tolerance, relapse and denial are just some of the many topics that will be explored. The second half of the evening will include the numerous options available for those seeking recovery including medications, therapies, various support groups and more. Each week introduces a particular virtue that can be practiced, especially during times of crisis.

**This week's virtue: prudence.**

### **October 3rd: Evening Two: Psychology**

Week two's focus is on some of the psychological theories that perhaps best explain the use of substances. We will journey through our human growth and development to consider our core wounds and the layers and layers of traits that we wear for protection which ultimately cause more harm than good. We will see that the common denominator in all our misguided attempts (whether using substances or not) is the desire to avoid more pain. The second half of the evening will include what is necessary to make the journey back to our true selves buried deep within.

**This week's virtue: empathy.**

### **October 10th: Evening Three: Sociology**

This third week's topic is on the impact of substance abuse on society, with a special focus on the small society of the family. We will learn why exactly addiction is referred to as a "family disease" and how exactly others in the family can become affected when they are not ingesting a substance. Themes such as blame, shame, anger, guilt, grief, caring, codependence, and much more will be explored. As always, the second half of the evening focuses on various solutions as well as some positive changes that are happening in society.

**This week's virtue: courage.**

### **October 17th: Evening Four: Spirituality**

The series concludes with an examination of our spiritual nature and how and why spirituality is an important part of the recovery process. Oftentimes the use of a substance is a misguided attempt to quench a spiritual thirst or craving. We will explore the missing piece to the puzzle of our lives, the God-shaped hole within each of us, and the only real way that this void can be filled.

**This week we will discuss not one, but three virtues: faith, hope and love.**

**This year's theme for September Recovery Month is  
"Join the Voices for Recovery: Our Families, Our Stories, Our Recovery"**

Recovery is Possible — Recovery is defined as a process of change through which individuals improve their health and wellness, live a self-directed life, and strive to reach their full potential. ## STV FOOD PANTRY NEEDS YOUR HELP!!

According to Feeding American in 2014, 15.5 million or approximately 21 percent of children in the U.S. lived in poverty. Twenty percent or more of the child population in 38 states and D.C. lived in food-insecure households in 2013, according to the most recent data available.

In this Year of Mercy declared by Pope Francis feeding the hungry is one way of encountering those in need. The Parish food closet accepts donations of non-perishable foods on a weekly basis. The items collected are then delivered to our sister parish, St. Cyprian's in West Philadelphia where approximately 300 families are assisted on a monthly basis.

- \* cold cereal and oatmeal
- \* rice
- \* soup
- \* canned fruit and 100% fruit juice
- \* tuna and canned sardines
- \* pasta and pasta sauce
- \* stew and chili
