A note from Fr. Joe

There's an old story about a wealthy, vacationing businessman who comes upon a fisherman, lying on the beach in the middle of the afternoon. Nearby is a handmade net and a battered rowboat. "You know," offered the businessman, "where I come from, it's a bit early in the day to knock off work." "My net is torn," replied the fisherman. "I won't have the material to repair it until tomorrow." "They've got these new synthetic nets," continued the businessman undeterred. "You can catch twice as many fish and they never tear." "What would I do with twice as many fish?" asked the fisherman. "Why, you could buy a second net, maybe a new boat or even two. Then you would have people working for you. Soon you could spend the afternoon – lying on a beach..."

The point of the story isn't to negate our labors, but to highlight how many of us spend time searching for something we already have. This Sunday's Readings remind us that what we surely have is God's forgiveness. It's there for the asking, if only we recognize it. Though often difficult for us to believe, no sin, once admitted, is beyond the mercy of God. Don't we all long to hear those words of Jesus, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace?" As it turns out, acknowledging our sins is a very small thing compared to the overwhelming flood of mercy and love it unleashes. Just look at David in the 1st Reading or the sinful woman in the Gospel. Just ask anyone who has experienced the grace of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As St. Paul declares in his Letter to the Galatians, "I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me."

This Sunday we also honor those men who give or have given of themselves in the vocation of fatherhood. Happy Father's Day to all our Dads and those who take the role of fathers in our lives! We remember too those fathers who have gone before us, including my own Dad.


