A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

LOVE ONE ANOTHER

The apocalyptic vision of John in Revelation offers the hopeful statement, "Behold, I make all things new." Jesus tells us in the Gospel, "I give you a new commandment: love one another." The enthusiastic proliferation of the Gospel recounted in Acts of the Apostles highlights the energy which possessed the first wave of Christians, empowering them to preach and teach this new way of looking at things. To put their lives on the line, going out to places and people they had never before encountered, was an act of love for those who had been so deeply impressed by Jesus Christ that they could not keep from dynamically proclaiming his good news. The old way was more inclined to judgment than acceptance, exclusion than openness and compassion. Along comes this charismatic figure whose primary emphasis is seeing the good in people, respecting them for their value as God's children, and the fresh air of the Spirit awakens them to a new way of looking at themselves and others. They were not enormously successful at first in the eyes of the world, but they eventually made an impact through their perseverance which has continued to this day.

The way of Jesus Christ was indeed new, his way of doing things stirringly uplifting. The reason his followers were so keen to share their good news was that they felt reborn in spirit, wanting to encourage others, as they had come to believe, that they were worthy of God's love as they experienced it from Jesus who had so evidently convinced them of it by his expansive love for them. It is this new commandment that Jesus speaks of in today's Gospel which, unfortunately, has yet to catch on as a way of life for the human race nowadays. As yet, society and governments do not practice the universal acceptance and respect modeled by the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Our world is still marred and dominated by suspicion, mistrust, vengeance and hatred.

Therefore, the mission continues to fall to us, as it did for the first wave of Christians, to keep trying to spread the good news of God's love in the face of sometimes overwhelming opposition. But as long as we strive to practice this new commandment, there is always hope that more and more others will be inspired to follow our example and seek to love one another as Jesus loved us.

Better Nutrition, Better Tomorrow: Bread for the World's 2019 Offering of Letters to Congress



Our parish's participation in the Bread for the World (BFW) 2019 Offering of Letters is critical to ensure "better nutrition" for a "better tomorrow" around the globe. BFW is a Christian, bipartisan organization that urges our nation's decision makers to end hunger and food insecurity at home and abroad. Only by changing policies, programs and conditions that allow hunger and food insecurity to persist will we eventually end hunger. This advocacy for social justice is as important as our charitable works to provide for the basic human needs of all.

Consider Uganda's Esther Okwir who was nearly five months pregnant with her first child when she walked a mile to her local clinic for a nutrition lesson. After a morning's work in her family's fields, Esther joined three dozen other moms-to-be and new mothers gathered around a midwife who promised a great future for their children. Esther and the other attendees were skeptical as they were well aware of the harsh reality of life in northern Uganda, where a child's mere survival was at risk due to challenging political and environmental circumstances. A half century of conflict and poverty had left a legacy of malnutrition and a dismal healthcare system.

In northern Uganda, the death rate of children under age 5 is among the worst in the world: 90 per 1,000 live births. Of the children who survive, 40 percent are stunted physically and cognitively with irreversible life consequences due to malnutrition. Esther and her husband had grown up during years of political terror, when families abandoned their farms and scrambled to find safety. With peace recently restored, Esther believed she was fortunate to give birth at a time when her country made improving child nutrition and reducing stunting a priority. Doing her part, Esther eagerly embraced a new initiative known as Harvest Plus, a U.S. government-funded program integrating agriculture and nutrition. Harvest Plus raises the nutrient levels already in staple crops, ensuring that more vitamins and minerals enter the diets of poor farmers. Esther and her husband, both smallholder farmers, planted the new Harvest Plus crops, and come harvest time, Esther included the two vegetables in nearly every meal. She had a healthy pregnancy and delivered a robust baby boy named Rodgers. As he grew, Rodgers was clearly beating the odds of a child in Uganda: his development was outpacing the growth charts, and he was neither malnourished nor stunted.

To accelerate progress on nutrition worldwide, we must scale up what we know works: improved access to nutritious foods, vitamins and minerals, clean water and sanitation, promotion of breastfeeding, and treatment for severe malnutrition. Current funding is not enough to reach our global nutrition goals, and powerful political forces are pushing to curtail poverty-focused assistance. All children like Rodgers deserve the opportunity to live a healthy life and reach their full potential.

As people of faith, we are called to care for one another and speak out for those in need. Please join us on the weekend of June 8-9 when our parish will hold its annual BFW letter writing campaign to urge our federal lawmakers to adequately fund programs and develop policies to protect and sustain the progress made over the past several years to reduce hunger and provide for better nutrition worldwide. Your persistent and faithful advocacy will be very important in defending the interests of people who are hungry as Jesus has challenged us to do. Your letters in these offerings are effective and are one of the best ways to demonstrate to our Congressional representatives that you really care about the issue.

St. Augustine Parish in Philadelphia is an historic landmark, the first Augustinian church in the US. They are engaged in a Capital Campaign for needed repairs and restoration, beginning with a celebration on June 1st, from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. at Villanova University's Finneran Pavilion.

Villanova University was instituted from the parish in 1842. After an anti-immigrant mob burned the Church to the ground in 1844, one of our stained glass windows (St. Nicholas of Tolentine) was brought here to the Villanova church when it was founded in the 1880s.

The Capital Campaign Gala on June 1 at Villanova University will feature Coach Jay Wright as the keynote speaker and Jim Murray, former Eagles General Manager, as the Master of Ceremonies and Auctioneer. This event includes an Open Bar, Hors d'oeuvres and Buffet Dinner, a behind-the-scenes tour of the new Finneran Pavilion and an auction of memorabilia from the Philadelphia Eagles, Villanova Basketball, Tom Brady-signed items and more.



..... is a new parish ministry serving families who are affected by miscarriage, stillbirth, and infant death. Brochures with our mission and services are now available in the Parish Center as well as the entrances of the Rosemont Chapel.

Did you know about all of the different ways we can help to serve those who are grieving? Here are some of the ways (part two of three part series):

Liturgies and Remembrances: We dedicate a weekend mass annually to the babies in our parish and community who have been lost through a miscarriage, stillbirth, or early death. The liturgy is typically held in October, National Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month, near the feast of St. Gerard Majella. If you are interested in participating in a more private service, please let us know. Our priests can also provide the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick over ill infants, mothers who are suffering a miscarriage or perinatal loss, and families experiencing emotional distress over their loss.

Burial Support: If you have the opportunity to bury your child, and wish to do so, please contact us for helpful information. We can connect you with Catholic merchants who carry small caskets for miscarried babies, as well as let you know of services local funeral home and cemeteries can provide to you. If you have been told that you will miscarry, and plan to miscarry at home, we can point you to resources regarding collecting your baby's remains in a dignified manner. We are also here to help you navigate the process with your doctor or midwife. Our priests also wish to minister to you through a liturgy, prayer service, or graveside service.
