ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Our priests, Pastoral Staff and Eucharistic Ministers visit the sick and homebound. Please advise the Parish Office if you need these services.

BAPTISM

Baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sunday of the month, except during Lent. Baptism dates and class dates are listed on the parish website. Call the Parish Office to receive the Baptism preparation packet and arrange a Baptism date with the Director of Liturgy.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is celebrated each year in the spring. Eligible candidates are baptized Catholic children in Grade 7 and higher. Please contact the Religious Education Department for details.

EUCCHARIST

Eucharist is celebrated according to the liturgy schedule. The Pastor and Eucharistic Ministers visit and bring Holy Communion to the homebound on a regular basis. Please call the Director of Liturgy at the Parish Office to have Holy Communion brought to anyone who may be homebound because of illness, disability or other conditions.

MARRIAGE

Please call the Director of Weddings at least eight months prior to the expected wedding date.

RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation is celebrated in the Rosemont Chapel every Saturday after the 9AM Mass and every Friday in Advent and Lent after the 12:05 PM Mass. Seasonally (Advent and Lent) Penance Services are held (dates vary and are published each year). Individuals are welcome to call the Parish Office to make an appointment to see a priest for Reconciliation.

R.C.I.A. (RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS)

Each year adults are initiated or brought into full communion with the Catholic Church. R.C.I.A. fosters a learning and loving process supporting the conversion of the heart. Please contact the Parish Office for additional information.

STEWARDSHIP MINISTRIES

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

BIBLE STUDY

Volunteers assist in leading small Bible study groups. Length and dates of the sessions are designed according to the participants' schedules. The meetings can be held in the Parish Center or a parishioner's home. Training and materials are provided to facilitators.

MEN'S MONTHLY GATHERING

Men in the parish meet the second Thursday of each month (September–June) at 6:30 AM in the Rosemont Chapel for Mass or a Communion Service followed by fellowship and occasional speakers in Harten Hall. Volunteers are needed to assist with planning and hospitality.

R.C.I.A.

Parishioners who join the R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) team guide and teach other adults interested in becoming Catholics. Sessions are conducted in small groups and are held periodically at the Parish Center, and scheduling is flexible. Training and resources are provided to catechists.

WALKING WITH PURPOSE

Women in the Walking with Purpose (WWP) Bible study meet in Harten Hall on Thursday mornings or Thursday evenings for fellowship and Bible study from October–April. Volunteers are needed to assist with planning, childcare and hospitality. (No actual walking involved!)

ADVENT GIVING TREE

Buyers, wrappers, Angel sellers and delivery people are needed for this ministry. During the first three weekends of Advent, parishioners make donations by purchasing “angels” that are hung from trees in each of our worship spaces. Volunteer angel sellers are needed for 15-20 minutes following the Mass they plan to attend. Volunteer buyers then purchase gifts for persons affiliated with faith-based organizations located in the Philadelphia area. Costs are fully covered by the sale of the angels. Gifts are wrapped during a scheduled time. Wrapping takes approximately 2-3 hours. The time commitment to deliver packages varies by location.

ALLELUIA MINISTRY

Volunteers serve as hospitality ministers to welcome parishioners and guests to Easter liturgies. Volunteers arrive one hour prior to the start of the Mass they plan to attend, greet people as they arrive, hand out worship aids and otherwise assist as needed prior to the start of the liturgy. At the end of the service, volunteers stay 15-30 minutes to hand out bulletins and other items and help prepare the worship space for the next liturgy. This is a wonderful ministry for families to do together.

ANTI-RACISM COMMITTEE

Parishioners meet monthly to discuss and plan educational opportunities to raise awareness of anti-racism initiatives. All are welcome.

BREAD FOR THE WORLD

The parish is a member of Bread for the World, a nationwide Christian movement that seeks justice for the world's hungry people by lobbying the nation's decision makers. Parishioners participate in an annual letter-writing campaign. Volunteers are needed to distribute packets and staff tables to encourage participation for 15-30 minutes after the Mass they plan to attend.

BUTTERFLY BLESSINGS

Parishioners knit or crochet baby blankets, baby hats and lap blankets for children at local hospitals. Volunteers are welcome to make these gifts at home and drop them off at the Parish Center for delivery.

CASSEROLES FOR ST. JOHN'S HOSPICE

Volunteers prepare casseroles for St. John's Hospice (SJH), a Catholic Social Services shelter for men located in Center City Philadelphia. Two freezers are located in the lower level of the Rosemont Chapel where the casseroles are stored until they are picked up by a member of the SJH staff each month. Frozen casseroles may be dropped off during Mass times or during the week when the Parish Center is open. Recipe suggestions, casserole tins and lids are available in the Parish Center.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES PARISH CHAPTER

The goal of the Catholic Relief Services (CRS) parish chapter is to equip and empower volunteers to become champions for the families and communities that CRS serves and to lead the way to a more just and peaceful world. Chapter members encourage our elected officials and the media to highlight and support CRS's lifesaving work. The chapter is a joint effort between our parish and our sister parish, St. Cyprian.

DINNERS TO THE DOORSTEP

Volunteers make and deliver dinners to families who request them when there is a need due to the arrival of a new baby, illness of a family member or other crisis. Two parish coordinators call volunteers as needed.

FAMILY PROMISE OF THE MAIN LINE

Several times a year, the parish hosts families experiencing homelessness for a one-week stay in the Parish Center. Meal providers, dinner hosts, overnight hosts and setup/cleanup crew are needed. The families move in on a Sunday evening and leave the following Sunday morning. Volunteers are needed for light lifting and moving during these Sunday hours. Volunteers prepare meals each night for the families, and two volunteers staff evening and overnight shifts to welcome and assist the families. This is a wonderful ministry for families to do together.

FOOD DRIVE COORDINATORS

Volunteers help organize and deliver large food collections in the parish. Deliveries of nonperishable food and other items will be made to St. Cyprian, our sister parish in West Philadelphia.

HUGS FOR HEROES

Volunteers help sort and pack a variety of items collected for military personnel serving overseas and for veterans in the Philadelphia area. The collection drive begins in mid-January and ends in mid-February.

IMMIGRANT OUTREACH AND REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT COMMITTEE

Volunteers help to address the needs of recent arrivals to our region. Activities range from assistance with housing, job searches, driver's licenses, ESL classes and medical appointments. The aim of the committee is to "welcome the stranger" and to provide accompaniment as needed.

INNKEEPERS MINISTRY

Volunteers serve as hospitality ministers to welcome parishioners and guests to Christmas liturgies. Volunteers arrive one hour prior to the start of the Mass they plan to attend, greet people as they arrive, hand out worship aids and otherwise assist as needed prior to the start of the liturgy. At the end of the service, volunteers plan to stay 15-30 minutes to hand out bulletins and other items and help prepare the worship space for the next liturgy. This is a wonderful ministry for families to do together.

JOY OF SOX

Founded by an STV parishioner in 2010, the Joy of Sox is a nonprofit whose mission is to provide joy to the homeless by giving them new socks. Volunteers are needed to assist with sorting and coordinating the delivery of donated socks.

MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY OF SERVICE

On Martin Luther King Day, parishioners participate in a full- or half-day of service projects in Harten Hall or in outreach events throughout the Philadelphia region. The service projects at the parish are geared toward our younger parishioners who work together with older volunteers on a variety of activities including crafts, sandwich-making and the assembly of toiletry bags for the homeless. Full-day outreach trips to a variety of service sites are available for middle school age students and teens.

MOTHER AND NEW FAMILY SUPPORT MINISTRY

Parishioner and nurse practitioner volunteers offer support to new moms and their families who are navigating the complexities of motherhood and the addition of a new baby to the family.

PARISH FOOD CLOSET

Volunteers help to maintain the donations received throughout the year for the parish food closet in Harten Hall. Volunteers assist with the purchase, sorting and delivery of food and other staples to our sister parish, St. Cyprian, and to other food pantries in the area.

PARKING MINISTRY

A group of parishioners volunteer to assist with traffic and parking outside the Rosemont Chapel during large liturgical celebrations.

PRAYER LINE

As part of a phone and/or email chain, volunteers are contacted to pray for special intentions and assist those in need of special prayers.

ST. FRANCIS INN MINISTRY

St. Francis Inn is a Franciscan community that ministers to the poor and homeless of the Kensington neighborhood of Philadelphia. A team of volunteers (must be 16 or older) helps to serve the midday meal on the third Sunday of each month. The team arrives at St. Francis Inn by 10:45 AM and is usually finished by 1 PM. Volunteers often carpool together from the Rosemont Chapel.

SHARE THE HARVEST

Volunteers are needed to grow or purchase fresh fruits and vegetables throughout July, August and September. Drivers are needed to deliver the produce to the food pantry at ElderNet in Bryn Mawr.

TURKEYS TO THE TABLE

Parishioners donate frozen turkeys and other items to provide Thanksgiving dinners for our sister parish, St. Cyprian, and members of its surrounding community. Volunteers are needed to help receive donations at the Villanova Church and Rosemont Chapel on the Sunday prior to Thanksgiving and deliver them to St. Cyprian. This is a great opportunity for families to volunteer together.

TUTORING - Online with the Aquinas Center

Volunteers tutor students (Grades K-12) one-on-one on Wednesdays from 5-5:45PM via Zoom breakout rooms. This program operates from October to May and is hosted by the Aquinas Center, an intercultural, multilingual, community-based organization in Philadelphia. Most of the students attend Philadelphia public schools and are in need of assistance with math and language arts. Tutors will be assigned to the grade level where they are most comfortable and usually work with the same student every week.

TUTORING - In person at St. Francis De Sales School

Volunteers tutor students (Grades 1-8) in the after-school homework club at St. Francis De Sales, an Archdiocesan Catholic school, serving a diverse student body of close to 500 students from 45 different countries. Tutors will be assigned to the grade level where they are most comfortable and may or may not work with the same student every week. The tutoring team meets weekly on Tuesdays at 2PM from October-May and carpools from the Rosemont Chapel to Philadelphia, returning at approximately 5PM.

AUGUSTINIAN FRIENDS

This social group for ages 50+ invites singles, widows/widowers, divorced and never married to join our ministry for fellowship, socialization, spirituality and volunteerism. Volunteers are needed to assist with planning.

BREAKFAST WITH SANTA

Parish families attend a Saturday breakfast with Santa in December. Volunteers are needed to help with planning, setup, serving and cleanup. Student volunteers are needed day of event.

BROWN BAG LUNCH SERIES

The Brown Bag Lunch planning committee arranges for speaker events approximately six times a year after the 12:05 PM Mass. Volunteers are needed to for setup, dessert coordination and cleanup (no heavy lifting).

POINSETTIA DELIVERY TO THE HOMEBOUND

Volunteers deliver poinsettias and holiday cheer to homebound members of our parish. This service opportunity takes place after our annual Breakfast with Santa.

SOUPERBOWL OF CARING

Families purchase groceries leading up to Superbowl Sunday that are donated to our parish food pantry.

FAMILY LIFE COMMITTEE

The Family Life Committee meets quarterly to plan and implement ministries and events designed to strengthen our families in faith. Throughout the years, the Family Life Committee has sponsored programs that support marriage, families with young children and parenting. All are welcome.

This committee works to support people through all stages of life through regular opportunities for prayer as well as opportunities to assist young mothers, newborn babies, the elderly and others in need.

SKATING PARTY

Families gather one evening in the winter for a "Take to the Ice" event at a local skating club. Volunteers are needed to help with setup, snacks and cleanup.

SPLASH PARTY

Families gather one evening in the summer for a party at a local swim club. Volunteers are needed to help with setup, serving dinner, games and cleanup. Student volunteers are needed day of event.

STV MOMS GROUP

Mothers of all ages gather monthly from September through May to hear speakers on relevant issues and to attend social gatherings for families. Key events include: Family Movie Nights, Pumpkin Decorating, and an Egg Hunt. Volunteers are needed to help with planning, running the events, recruitment and service projects.

CYO SPORTS

Volunteers are needed to coach teams in the CYO Athletics program offered through the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Volunteers are needed, Sports teams include track, cross country, basketball and baseball for girls and boys.

STEWARDSHIP SUMMER CAMPS

Parish students in Grades 5-8 are invited to participate in a week-long day camp at the beginning of the summer. High school age parishioners are invited to volunteer as counselors. The week provides faith-based stewardship education, leadership development and an opportunity to share time and talent with mission driven non-profit agencies that serve our area.

YOUTH MINISTRY

The goal of Youth Ministry is to deepen the Catholic faith of young parishioners in Grades 7-12 so that they may more fully live out the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Youth Ministry meets monthly for faith formation and periodically for social events and retreats. Adult volunteers are needed to chaperone, run and facilitate youth events under the guidance of the Director of Youth Ministry. Students can participate in service events including Turkeys to the Table, Poinsettia Deliveries for the Homebound, Souper Bowl of Caring and Martin Luther King Day of Service.

YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY

Young adults, ages 21-35, gather for social, spiritual and service events throughout the year. Young Adult Volunteers are needed to help coordinate and lead parish Young Adult Ministry events. Events include: Theology on Tap, Holy Hour, socials and service.

CANTORS

Cantors serve as the primary music leaders at the weekend liturgies. Cantors are required to have basic music training and to attend a rehearsal prior to each Mass for which they sing.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR

The Choir includes singers in grades 1-8 and assists monthly during 9:00 AM Masses. The choir also performs locally 1-2 times per year. Choir members will receive classical choral instruction. Practices are held on Sunday mornings after REP and Wednesday evenings before REP in the Rosemont Chapel.

The Youth Music Ministry includes singers and instrumentalists in grades 7-12 and assists monthly at the Saturday, 5 PM Vigil Mass in the Rosemont Chapel, with rehearsal beforehand at 3:30 PM. Additional weekly rehearsals are held on Wednesday nights in Rosemont Chapel.

CHOIR

Our Adult choir is an integral part of the liturgical life of our parish. The choir provides an abundance of outstanding classical and contemporary sacred music spanning the centuries. In addition to singing for the principal liturgies throughout the liturgical year including Christmas and Holy Week, and for the weekly 10:30 AM Mass each Sunday, the choir also presents various special events throughout the liturgical year, including an Advent Lessons and Carols. Prior choral experience is helpful but not necessary. Rehearsals are held on Tuesday nights from September through May.

INSTRUMENTALISTS

From time to time various instruments accompany our liturgies, mainly as ensemble accompaniment for the hymn singing and for the choir. Occasionally, instrumentalists play a solo composition. Proficiency in a particular instrument is expected.

The Laetate (meaning "Rejoice") Ringers, our parish Handbell Choir, is open to all ages. It assists monthly during the 9:00 AM or 5:00 PM Vigil Masses in the Rosemont Chapel and rehearses on Thursdays at 7:15 PM from September through May. The choir also participates in special events, such as Lessons and Carols. Ability to read music is helpful but not required.

BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENINGS

Blood pressure screenings take place on the first Tuesday of each month after the 12:05 PM Mass in the Rosemont Chapel. Nurses are needed to take blood pressures at scheduled times.

HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM

Programs are offered in the spring and the fall with an emphasis on treatment, prevention and ways to deal with an illness. Volunteers are needed to assist with planning.

BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

The Grief Support Group provides a safe, caring and compassionate place where those grieving loss can share their experience with others, learn about the grief process and be supported by fellow parishioners during a difficult time. Groups meet for six weeks in the fall and spring.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS TO ROSEMONT CARE CENTER

A team of volunteers brings the Eucharist to the Catholic residents at Rosemont Care Center on Monday mornings. This ministry is especially well-suited for those who are current or former Eucharistic Ministers. The time commitment is usually one Monday per month.

THE MANSION AT ROSEMONT SUNDAY COMMUNION SERVICES

Parish volunteers lead a weekly Communion Service on Sunday mornings at 11 AM at The Mansion at Rosemont. This ministry is especially well-suited for those who are current or former Eucharistic Ministers. The time commitment is usually once every four to six weeks on a Sunday morning.

The Religious Education Program (REP) meets weekly on Sunday mornings from 10:10 - 11:25 AM and on Wednesday afternoons from 4:45-6:00 PM, providing faith formation for students in Grades K-6. Home schooling is available for Grades K-6.

CATECHISTS / TEACHERS & ASSISTANTS

Volunteers are needed to teach religion or assist other teachers each week. Training and materials are provided. No experience is required.

HALL MONITORS

Volunteers are needed to serve as hall monitors to greet families, assist teachers with copies and supplies and secure the locked doors during REP classes.

PARKING ATTENDANTS

Volunteers are needed as parking lot attendants to provide supervision at dismissal on Sundays and/or Wednesdays.

CHILDREN’S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Children’s liturgy of the word is held on the first Sunday of the month, from October through April, during the 9AM Mass.

ALTAR SERVERS

Volunteers are needed to assist at the celebration of the weekend liturgy, daily liturgy or special liturgical events. Training is provided. The ministry is open to baptized parishioners in Grade 5 or older.

BAPTISM TEAM MINISTRY

Volunteers are needed to assist with the celebration of the sacrament by welcoming families, setting up for Baptism and assisting the priest or deacon during Baptism and cleaning up after the Baptism. Members serve based on their calendar of availability.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS TO THE HOMEBOUND

New or retired Eucharistic Ministers are needed to bring Holy Communion to homebound parishioners on a weekly basis at a mutually convenient time during the week or on a weekend.

HOSPITALITY MINISTERS

Volunteers are needed to greet and welcome parishioners and guests at all weekend liturgies. This is typically combined with usher responsibilities.

USHERS

Volunteers are needed to assist at weekend liturgies or special liturgical celebrations with collection, Communion procession and distribution of bulletins.

LAUNDRY ANGELS

Volunteers are needed to wash and iron linens used each week at liturgy at the Rosemont Chapel. This is a once a month commitment. Linens can be picked up and returned to Rosemont Chapel sacristy.

LAZARUS MINISTRY

Volunteers are needed to assist at funeral liturgies as Altar Server. Training is provided. Volunteers also needed to assist with an annual Mass of Remembrance as Ministers of Hospitality.

LECTORS

Volunteers are needed to prepare and proclaim the Scripture for daily or weekend liturgies and special liturgical celebrations. Training is provided to parishioners who have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

LITURGY COMMITTEE

Volunteers are needed to assist the pastor as a consultative committee. This committee meets three or four times a year for planning, evaluation and discussion of liturgical issues.

MASS COORDINATORS

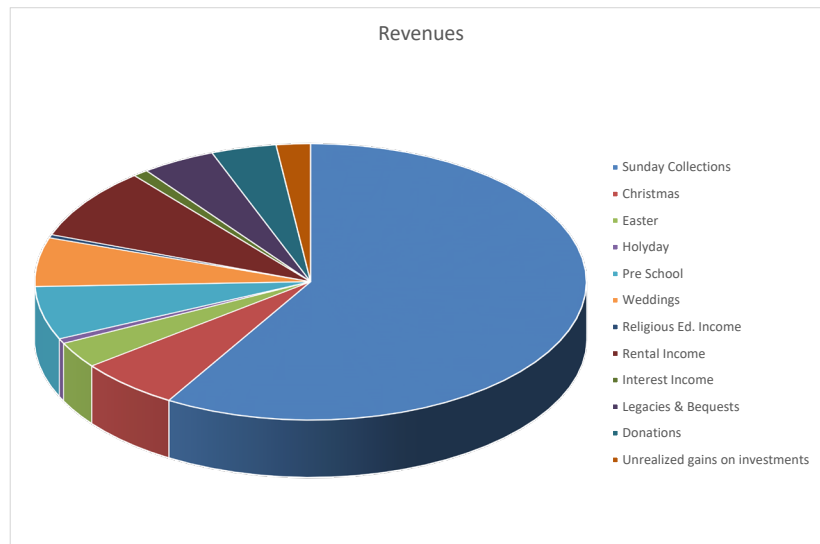
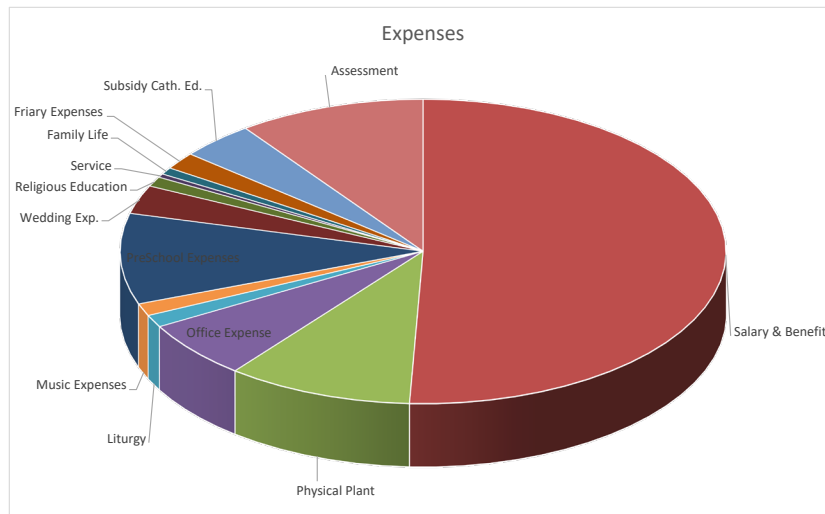
