PARISH MISSION STATEMENT



SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Our priests, Pastoral Staff and Eucharistic Ministers visit the sick and homebound. Please advise the parish office if you need these services.

BAPTISM

Baptisms are celebrated each month, except during Lent. Baptism dates and class dates are listed on the parish website. Call the Parish Office to receive the Baptism preparation packet and arrange a Baptism date with the Director of Liturgy.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is celebrated each year in the spring. Eligible candidates are baptized Catholic children in grade 7 and higher. Please contact the Religious Education Department for details.

EUCHARIST

Eucharist is celebrated according to the liturgy schedule. The Pastor and Eucharistic Ministers visit and bring Holy Communion to the homebound on a regular basis. Please call the Director of Liturgy at the Parish Center to have Holy Communion brought to anyone who may be homebound because of illness, disability, or other conditions.

MARRIAGE

Please call the Director of Weddings at twelve eight months prior to the expected wedding date.

RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation is celebrated in the Rosemont Chapel every Saturday after the 9 AM Mass and every Friday in Advent and Lent after the 12:05 Mass. Seasonally (Advent and Lent) we have Penance Services in the Villanova Church (dates vary and are published each year). Individuals are always welcome to call the parish office to make an appointment to see a priest for Reconciliation.

R.C.I.A. (RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS)

Each year adults are initiated or brought into full communion with the Catholic Church. R.C.I.A. fosters a learning and loving process supporting the conversion of the heart. Please contact the Parish Office for additional information.

Volunteers assist in leading small Bible study groups. Length and dates of the sessions are designed according to the participants' schedules. The meetings can be held in the Parish Center or a parishioner's home. Training and materials are provided.

MEN'S MONTHLY GATHERING

Men in the parish meet the second Thursday of each month (September–June) at 6:30am in the Rosemont Chapel for Mass or a Communion Service followed by fellowship and occasional speakers in the Parish Auditorium.

R.C.I.A. CATECHISTS

Parishioners who join the R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) team guide and teach other adults interested in becoming Catholics. Sessions are conducted in small groups and are held periodically at the Parish Center and scheduling is flexible. Training and resources are provided.

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY - WALKING WITH PURPOSE

ADVENT GIVING TREE

Buyers, wrappers, angel sellers, and delivery people are need for this ministry. During the first three weekends of the Advent Season, parishioners make donations by purchasing "angels" which are hung from trees in each of our worship spaces. Volunteer buyers then purchase gifts for persons affiliated with one of five faith-based organizations located in Philadelphia. Costs are fully covered by the sale of the angels. Gifts are wrapped during a scheduled time. Wrapping takes approximately 2-3 hours. Angel sellers only serve for 10-20 minutes following the Mass they are attending. The time commitment to deliver packages varies by location.

ALLELUIA MINISTRY

Serve as a hospitality minister to welcome parishioners and guests to Easter liturgies. Arrive one hour prior to the start of the Mass you plan to attend, greet people as they arrive, hand out worship aids and otherwise assist as needed prior to the start of the liturgy. At the end of the service, plan to stay 15-30 minutes to hand out bulletins and other items, help prepare the worship space for the next liturgy, etc. This is a wonderful ministry for families to do together.

ANTI-RACISM COMMITTEE

Following the instruction of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in their letter "Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love, A Pastoral Letter Against Racism" (2018), members of the Anti-Racism Committee (ARC):

"endeavor to be missionary disciples carrying forth the message of fraternal [sic] [familial] charity and human dignity....to fight the evil of racism by educating themselves, reflecting on their personal thoughts and actions, listening to the experience of those who have been affected by racism, and by developing and supporting programs that help repair the damages caused by racial discrimination" (27).

Parishioners meet the 4th Tuesday of most months, from 7:00 pm till 8:15 pm on Zoom. One takes a turn to chair the meeting and present on a topic of their choosing, which is followed by discussion. All are welcome.

BREAD FOR THE WORLD

The parish is a member of Bread for the World, a nationwide Christian movement that seeks justice for the world's hungry people by lobbying the nation's decision makers. Parishioners participate in a letter-writing campaign in June each year. Teens and adults are needed to distribute packets and staff tables to encourage participation after weekend liturgies.

BUTTERFLY BLESSINGS

Parishioners knit or crochet baby blankets, baby hats, and lap blankets (for wheelchairs) for children at local children's hospitals. You can make as many baby gifts as you can at home.

CASSEROLES FOR ST. JOHN'S HOSPICE

Volunteers prepare casseroles for St. John's Hospice (SJH), a Catholic Social Services shelter for men located in Center City Philadelphia. We have two freezers in the lower level of the Rosemont Chapel where we store the casseroles until they are picked up by a member of the SJH staff each month. Frozen casseroles may be dropped off during Mass times or during the week when the Parish Center is open. Recipe suggestions, casserole tins and lids are available in the Parish Center.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES (CRS) PARISH CHAPTER

The goal of the Chapter is to equip and empower volunteers to become champions for the families and communities that CRS serves, and to lead the way to a more just and peaceful world. Chapter members encourage our elected officials and the media to highlight and support

CRS's lifesaving work, and mobilize essential resources that make CRS's work possible. The Chapter is a joint effort between our parish and our sister parish, St. Cyprian.

CRADLES TO CRAYONS

Parish volunteers (middle school age and older) go to the Cradles to Crayons warehouse in Philadelphia throughout the year to sort and process new or nearly new children's items donated by the local community. Volunteers package items that are later distributed to disadvantaged children through a collaborative network of social service agencies and school partners.

DINNERS TO THE DOORSTEP

Volunteers make and deliver dinners to families who request them when there is a need due to the arrival of a new baby, illness of a family member, or other crisis. Two parish coordinators call volunteers as needed.

FAMILY PROMISE OF THE MAIN LINE (formerly IHN)

Five times a year, the parish hosts homeless families for a one-week stay in the Parish Center. Meal providers, dinner hosts, overnight hosts, and set up/clean up crew are needed. The families move in on a Sunday evening and leave the following Sunday morning. Volunteers are needed for light lifting and moving during these Sunday hours. Volunteers prepare meals each night for the families, and two volunteers staff evening and overnight shifts to welcome and assist the families. This is a wonderful ministry for families to do together.

FOOD DRIVE COORDINATORS

Volunteers needed to organize and deliver large food collections in the parish. Deliveries of nonperishable food and other items will be made to our sister parish in West Philadelphia.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Join our parish team (must be 16 years or older) and work at a Habitat for Humanity construction site in Philadelphia. The team participates on various Saturdays throughout the year, meeting around 7:30 am at the Rosemont Chapel and working at the construction site from approximately 8:30-2:00 pm. Dates and times will vary.

HOLIDAY HUGS FOR HEROES

Volunteers help sort and pack (and mail if needed) a variety of items collected for military personnel serving overseas and for veterans in the Philadelphia area. The collection drive begins in mid-January and ends in mid-February.

IMMIGRANT OUTREACH AND REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT COMMITTEE

This committee works to address the needs of recent arrivals to our region. Activities range from assistance with housing, job searches, driver's licenses, ESL classes and medical appointments. The aim of the committee is to "welcome the stranger" and to provide accompaniment as needed.

INNKEEPERS MINISTRY

Serve as a hospitality minister to welcome parishioners and guests to Christmas liturgies. Arrive one hour prior to the start of the Mass you plan to attend, greet people as they arrive, hand out worship aids and otherwise assist as needed prior to the start of the liturgy. At the end of the

service, plan to stay 15-30 minutes to hand out bulletins and other items, help prepare the worship space for the next liturgy, etc. This is a wonderful ministry for families to do together.

JOY OF SOX

Founded by an STV parishioner in 2010, the Joy of Sox is a nonprofit whose mission is to provide joy to the homeless by giving them new socks. Volunteers are needed to assist with sorting and coordinating the delivery of donated socks.

MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY OF SERVICE

On Martin Luther King Day, parishioners participate in a full or half day of service projects in the Rosemont Auditorium or in outreach events throughout the Philadelphia region. The service projects at the parish are geared toward our younger parishioners who work together with older volunteers on a variety of activities including crafts, sandwich making, and the assembly of toiletry bags for the homeless. Full day outreach trips to a variety of service sites are available for middle school age students and teens. For those who cannot attend in person, "Service in a Box" activities are available for families to complete at home.

MOTHER AND NEW FAMILY SUPPORT MINISTRY

Parishioner and nurse practitioner volunteer offers support to new moms and their families who are navigating the complexities of motherhood and the addition of a new baby to the family.

PARISH FOOD CLOSET

Volunteers help to maintain the donations received throughout the year for the parish food closet in the Rosemont Auditorium. Volunteers assist with the purchase, sorting and delivery of food and other staples to our sister parish and to other food pantries in the area.

PARKING MINISTRY

A group of parishioners facilitate parking outside the Rosemont Chapel during large liturgical celebrations (Easter, Christmas, etc.)

PEACE AND JUSTICE COMMITTEE

Parishioners encourage the parish to act both in direct ministry and advocacy to bring about social justice. Committee members meet throughout the year to plan and implement peace and justice activities, including prayer, speakers and presentations.

PRAYER LINE

As part of a phone and/or email chain, volunteers are contacted to pray for special intentions and assist those in need of special prayers.

ST. FRANCIS INN MINISTRY

St. Francis Inn is a Franciscan community which ministers to the poor and homeless of the Kensington neighborhood of Philadelphia. A team of 5-6 volunteers (must be 16 or older) helps to serve the midday meal on the third Sunday of each month. The community residents are served "restaurant style" and the volunteers help fill plates, bus tables, etc. The team arrives at St. Francis Inn by 10:45 am and is usually finished by 1 pm. Volunteers often carpool together from the Rosemont Chapel.

SATURDAY FOOD RUN TO ST. FRANCIS INN

Each Saturday afternoon, a team of volunteers collects the leftover food from the vendors at the Farmers Market in Wayne and transports the donations to St. Francis Inn in Kensington. Volunteers arrive at the Farmers Market about 10-15 minutes prior to closing time. Each Saturday the time commitment is approximately two hours (which includes the drive to and from Kensington). With the number of volunteers involved in this ministry, the individual commitment is 3-4 times a year.

SHARE THE HARVEST

Parishioners are needed to grow or purchase fresh fruits and vegetables throughout July, August and September. Drivers are needed to deliver the produce to the food pantry at ElderNet in Bryn Mawr.

TURKEYS TO THE TABLE

Parishioners donate frozen turkeys and other items for complete Thanksgiving dinners for our sister parish (St. Cyprian) and members of its surrounding community. Volunteers are needed to help receive donations on the Sunday prior to Thanksgiving and deliver them to St. Cyprian. This is a great opportunity for families to volunteer together.

TUTORING

Volunteers are needed to work with children and adults throughout the region who have varying levels of education and needs. Currently, we have a team of volunteers working with students online, providing after school homework help and other academic assistance. In person opportunities are available to work with children and adults, particularly with recent arrivals in need of language support.

BREAKFAST WITH SANTA

Parish families attend a Saturday breakfast with Santa in December. Volunteers need to help with planning, set-up, serving, and clean-up. Student volunteers are needed day of event.

FAMILY LIFE COMMITTEE

The Family Life Committee meets quarterly to plan and implement ministries and events designed to strengthen our families in faith. Throughout the years, the Family Life Committee has sponsored programs that support marriage, families with young children and parenting in today's world.

This is a Parish Ministry committed to spiritual, as well as practical, support for individuals and/or families suffering from the effects of addiction. The team is available to pray with, listen to and

provide compassionate support in a safe and confidential manner. We are not professionals; we are fellow Catholics living the call to be "missioners of mercy."

MOMS GROUP

Mothers of all ages gather monthly from September through May to hear speakers on relevant issues and to attend social gatherings for families. Key events include: Family Movie nights, Pumpkin Decorating, Egg Hunt. Volunteers help with planning, running the events, recruitment, and service projects.

SKATE PARTY

Families gather one evening in the winter for a "Take to the Ice" event at a local skate club. Volunteers help with setup, snacks, & cleanup.

SPLASH PARTY

Families gather one evening in the summer for a party at a local swim club. Volunteers help with setup, serving dinner, games and cleanup. Student volunteers needed day of event.

YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY

Young adults, 21-35, gather for social, spiritual, and service events throughout the year. Young Adult Volunteers are needed to help coordinate and lead parish Young Adult Ministry events. Events include: Theology on Tap, Holy Hour, socials and service.

CYO SPORTS

STV Parish participates in the CYO Athletics program offered through the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Volunteers needed to coach teams. Sports teams include track, cross country, basketball, and baseball for girls and boys.

GIRLS BIBLE STUDY – BLAZE

Blaze is small group faith sharing with content created by Walking with Purpose. Volunteers needed to help run, support, and chaperone Blaze sessions with Director.

STEWARDSHIP SUMMER CAMPS

Parish students in grades 5-8 are invited to participate in a week-long day camp at the beginning of the summer. High school age Parish students are invited to volunteer as counselors. The week provides faith-based stewardship education, leadership development, and an opportunity to share time and talent with mission- driven non-profit agencies that serve our area.

YOUTH MINISTRY

The goal of Youth Ministry is to deepen the Catholic faith of young parishioners in grades 7-12, so that they may more fully live out the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Youth Ministry meets monthly for faith formation and periodically for social events and retreats. Adult volunteers are needed to chaperone, run and facilitate youth events under the guidance of the Director of Youth Ministry. Students can participate in service. Service events include Turkeys to the Table, Poinsettia Deliveries for the homebound, Souper Bowl of Caring, and MLK Outreach Service Trip and more.

CANTORS

Cantors serve as the primary music leaders at the weekend liturgies. Cantors are required to have basic music training and to attend a rehearsal prior to each Mass for which they sing.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR

The Choir includes singers in grades 1-8 and assists monthly during 9:00 am Masses. The choir also performs locally 1-2x per year. Choir members will receive classical choral instruction. Practices are held on Sunday mornings after REP and Wednesday evenings before REP in the Rosemont Chapel.

The Youth Music Ministry includes singers and instrumentalists in grades 7-12 and assists monthly at the Saturday, 5:00 pm Vigil Mass in the Rosemont Chapel, with rehearsal beforehand at 3:30 pm. Additional weekly rehearsals on Wednesday nights in Rosemont Chapel.

CHOIR

Our Adult choir is an integral part of the liturgical life of our parish. They provide an abundance of outstanding classical and contemporary sacred music spanning the centuries. In addition to singing for the principal liturgies throughout the Liturgical Year including Christmas and Holy Week, and for the weekly 10:30 am Choral Mass each Sunday, the choir also presents various special events throughout the Liturgical Year, including an Advent Lessons and Carols. Prior choral experience is helpful but not necessary. Rehearsals are held on Tuesday nights from September through May.

INSTRUMENTALISTS

From time to time various instruments accompany our liturgies, mainly as ensemble accompaniment for the hymn singing and for the choir. Occasionally, instrumentalists play a solo composition. Proficiency in a particular instrument is expected.

The Laetate (meaning "Rejoice") Ringers, our parish Handbell Choir, is open to all ages. It assists monthly during the 9:00 am or 5:00 pm Vigil Masses in the Rosemont Chapel, and rehearses there on Thursdays at 7:15 pm from September through May. It also participates in special events, such as Lessons and Carols. Ability to read music is helpful but not required.

Assist with the celebration of the sacrament by welcoming families, setting up for Baptism, and assisting priest or deacon during Baptism and cleaning up after the Baptism. Members serve based on their calendar of availability.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS TO THE HOMEBOUND

New or retired Eucharistic Ministers are needed to bring Holy Communion to homebound parishioners on a weekly basis at a mutually convenient time during the week or on a weekend.

HOSPITALITY MINISTERS

Greet and welcome parishioners and guests at all weekend liturgies. Typically combined with usher responsibilities.

USHERS

Assist at weekend liturgies or special liturgical celebrations with collection, Communion procession and distribution of bulletins. May also assist hospitality ministers.

LAUNDRY ANGELS

Wash and iron linens used each week at liturgy at the Rosemont Chapel. One-month commitment. Linens picked up and returned to Rosemont Chapel sacristy.

LAZARUS MINISTRY

Assist at funeral liturgies as Altar Server. Training provided. Also, assist with annual Mass of Remembrance as Ministers of Hospitality.

LECTORS

Prepare and proclaim the Scripture for daily or weekend liturgies and special liturgical celebrations. Training provided to parishioners who have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

LITURGY COMMITTEE

Assists Pastor as a consultative committee, meets three or four times a year for planning, evaluation, and discussion of liturgical issues.

MASS COORDINATORS

Assist at weekend liturgies or special liturgical celebrations, checking in liturgical ministers and helping ministries to run smoothly.

SACRISTANS

Assist at daily or weekend liturgies or special liturgical celebrations. Set up for liturgy and clean up after liturgy. May assist ushers with collection and Communion procession. Training provided.




