To Help You Remember

Key Teachings



Listen to the Messengers of God

Just as we learned last week that God gave us the Ten Commandments to guide us, so we are to pay attention to the messengers of God who bring God's Word to us today.

Receive the Gift

We cannot earn grace by our words and deeds. Grace is God's free gift to us. Grace helps us live as children of God.

Faith Words



Grace

Grace is the gift of God sharing his life and love with us. The types of grace include sanctifying grace, actual grace, and sacramental graces.

Sanctifying Grace

The word *sanctifying* comes from a Latin word meaning "to make holy". Sanctifying grace is God's gift, given by the Holy Spirit, that frees us from sin and makes us holy.

Amazing Grace



John Newton (1725-1807), who wrote "Amazing Grace," did not grow up believing in God. Caught on a ship in a storm at sea, he cried out to God for mercy, and – after arriving safe on land – began to question if God was indeed real. In the years that followed, John Newton became a Christian and a writer of many hymns.

With My Family



We Listen

The Israelites ignored God's messages. They did not listen to God and as a result their enemies defeated and captured them. It was a dark time for the Israelites, until King Cyrus set them free. In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that God sent the light into the world. Jesus is that light. He is the light that saves us.

We Believe

The world is full of grace. Grace is God's life with us. Even though there is sin and darkness in the world, there is more grace. Grace is always stronger and more powerful than evil. Light will always break through the dark.

We Live As Disciples

Jesus' disciples live in truth and light. How can you take light to someone who is in darkness? Who do you know that is sad, or lonely, or scared? What can you do to be a light in their life?

We Pray

Pray together these words from the Second Scrutiny:

"... God ... dispel darkness and be the light that shines in the hearts of our elect" (RCIA 167).

Allow time for all to quietly think of ways they will take light to someone who is in darkness.

Then, pray again the words from the Second Scrutiny.
